
Recreational Fishing in Rhode Island



Find a Fishing Access Site

There are more than 100 public saltwater fishing access sites in Rhode Island. You can search for them all—and find out whether amenities like tackle shops and restaurants are nearby—through the **Marine Recreational Information Program Site Register**. This free online database lists thousands of places to fish from Maine through Louisiana. The site register also helps determine where and when field interviewers from the Rhode Island Division of Marine Fisheries will conduct angler surveys to estimate recreational catch.
